Communication

Being able to communicate with your doctor is very important to your health. The Deaf Access Program addresses this communication need by providing Sign language interpreters upon request at Mount Sinai Hospital and Access Community Health Network health centers.

Medical Care

The Deaf Access Program’s three primary care doctors are experts in their fields. They are Board Certified, widely published and nationally recognized in teaching, research and patient care. What makes them special to deaf patients is their experience in ASL and their familiarity with deaf culture. They provide:

- Internal (adult) Medicine
- Pediatric (children) Medicine
- Referrals for specialty care

Psychiatry and Behavioral Health

The Deaf Access Program also offers the following behavioral health services:

- Diagnostic interviews
- Psychiatric evaluations
- Crisis Intervention
- Individual and family therapy
- Group therapy
- Inpatient psychiatric services

These services can help with issues such as depression, anxiety, anger or other feelings that interfere with normal daily life.

Payment for Medical Services

Medicaid, Medicaid HMO, Medicare and most major health insurances are accepted at ACCESS health centers and Mount Sinai Hospital. For patients without insurance, a sliding fee scale is available based on ability to pay. No one is ever turned away due to lack of payment.
